International Benchmark Tests



The IEB, in partnership with the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER), offers schools the opportunity to participate in the International Benchmark Tests. ACER is an established player in global research and assessment activities and their IBTs have been designed to offer a series of skills-based tests in English, Mathematics, Reasoning and Science. As part of its strategy to ensure that learners receiving a South African education remain globally competitive, the IEB offers South African schools the opportunity to participate in these assessments every October.

In addition, IBT@Home offers individual learners the opportunity to write a uniquely generated test on request at any time of the year. This option is available in English, Mathematics and Science and is ideally suited to the home-schooler or to schools who wish to use the test to assist in learner placement.

ACER's tests are valid, reliable and sound in respect of test design theory. The tests are designed to measure and recognise a learner's performance in a range of skills that underpin the teaching of each of the subject areas. Each test caters for a range of ability levels within a class group and the tests are based on an assessment model that enables results to be directly linked to a learner's learning in the classroom.
